**Clackamas County Cultural Coalition Distributes \$25,430
to 19 Local Grant Recipients**

New Funding Will Be Used to Support Local Arts, Heritage & Humanities Projects

The Clackamas County Cultural Coalition awarded a total of \$25,430 to seventeen arts and culture organizations and two individuals through the seventh Community Cultural Participation Grant program. A total of \$91,551 was requested by Clackamas County grant applicants.

The Grant Program's purpose is to locally distribute private funds contributed to the Oregon Cultural Trust in support of goals and funding priorities outlined in the Clackamas County Plan for Arts, Heritage and Humanities. This year's priorities included: Creative People and Organizations, Heritage and History, Participation in the Arts, Heritage and Humanities, Public Art, Facilities and Sites, K - 12 Education and Lifelong Learning, and Natural Sites.

An independent Grant Review Panel was convened to review the 29 applications received. The 19 applicants and projects recommended for funding (including eight first time recipients) are:

The Oregon Cultural Trust is an innovative, statewide private-public program that raises money to support and protect Oregon’s arts, humanities and heritage. In addition to creating a long-term, protected endowment, the Trust distributes funds annually through three multi-faceted, wide-ranging grant programs. Donors to the Trust are eligible for a 100-percent Oregon income tax credit for contributions of up to \$500 for individuals, \$1,000 for couples filing jointly and \$2,500 for corporations. To motivate Oregonians to increase direct giving to cultural groups, Since 2002, Oregonians have contributed over \$21 million to the Trust. The Trust has awarded over \$9 million in grants to every corner of the state. More information is available at www.culturaltrust.org.
